Matthew 7:21 (NKJV) "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven.

Matthew 7:22 (NKJV) Many will say to Me in that day, 'Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?'

Matthew 7:23 (NKJV) And then I will declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!'

Matthew 7:24 (NKJV) "Therefore whoever hears these sayings of Mine, and does them, I will liken him to a wise man who built his house on the rock:

Matthew 7:25 (NKJV) and the rain descended, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house; and it did not fall, for it was **founded on the rock**.

Matthew 7:26 (NKJV) "But **everyone who hears** these sayings of Mine, and **does not do** them, will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand:

Matthew 7:27 (NKJV) and the rain descended, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house; and it fell. **And great was its fall**."

- **2** Chronicles 14:1 (NKJV) So Abijah (*Evil King*) rested with his fathers, and they buried him in the City of David. Then **Asa** his son reigned in his place. In his days the land was quiet for ten years.
- 2 Chronicles 14:2 (NKJV) As a did what was good and right in the eyes of the Lord his God,
- **2 Chronicles 14:3 (NKJV)** for **he removed** the altars of the foreign gods and the high places, and **broke down** the sacred pillars and **cut down** the wooden images.
- 2 Chronicles 14:4 (NKJV) He commanded Judah to seek the Lord God of their fathers, and to observe the law and the commandment.
- **2** Chronicles 14:5 (NKJV) He also removed the high places and the incense altars from all the cities of Judah, and the kingdom was quiet under him.
- 2 Chronicles 14:6 (NKJV) And he built fortified cities in Judah, for the land had rest; he had no war in those years, because the Lord had given him rest.
- 2 Chronicles 14:7 (NKJV) Therefore he said to Judah, "Let us build these cities and make walls around them, and towers, gates, and bars, while the land is yet before us, because we have sought the Lord our God; we have sought Him, and He has given us rest on every side." So they built and prospered.

Chronicles 14:8 (NKJV) And Asa had an army of three hundred thousand from ludah who carried shields and spears, and from Benjamin two hundred and eighty thousand men who carried shields and drew bows; all these were mighty men of valor. Chronicles 14:9 (NKJV) Then Zerah the Ethiopian came out against them with an army of a million men and three hundred chariots, and he came to Mareshah.	 2 Chronicles 16:7 (NKJV) And at that time Hanani the seer came to Asa king of Judah, and said to him: "Because you have relied on the king of Syria, and have not relied on the Lord your God, therefore the army of the king of Syria has escaped from your hand. 2 Chronicles 16:8 (NKJV) Were the Ethiopians and the Lubim not a huge army with very many chariots and horsemen? Yet, because you relied on the Lord, He delivered them into your hand. 2 Chronicles 16:9 (NKJV) For the eyes of the Lord run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to show Himself strong on behalf of those whose heart is loyal to Him. In this you have done foolishly; therefore from now on you shall have wars." 2 Chronicles 16:10 (NKJV) Then Asa was angry with the seer, and put him in prison, for he was enraged at him because of this. And Asa oppressed some of the people at that time.
Chronicles 14:10 (NKJV) So Asa went out against him, and they set the troops in pattle array in the Valley of Zephathah at Mareshah. Chronicles 14:11 (NKJV) And Asa cried out to the Lord his God, and said, "Lord, it is nothing for You to help, whether with many or with those who have no power; help is, O Lord our God, for we rest on You, and in Your name we go against this multitude. O Lord, You are our God; do not let man prevail against You!" Chronicles 14:12 (NKJV) So the Lord struck the Ethiopians before Asa and Judah, and the Ethiopians fled. Chronicles 14:13 (NKJV) And Asa and the people who were with him pursued them to Gerar. So the Ethiopians were overthrown, and they could not recover, for they were proken before the Lord and His army. And they carried away very much spoil. Chronicles 14:14 (NKJV) Then they defeated all the cities around Gerar, for the fear of the Lord came upon them; and they plundered all the cities, for there was exceedingly much spoil in them. Chronicles 14:15 (NKJV) They also attacked the livestock enclosures, and carried off theep and camels in abundance, and returned to Jerusalem.	2 Chronicles 16:12 (NKJV) And in the thirty-ninth year of his reign, Asa became diseased in his feet, and his malady was severe; yet in his disease he did not seek the Lord, but the physicians. 2 Chronicles 16:13 (NKJV) So Asa rested with his fathers; he died in the forty-first year of his reign.

Chronicles 16:1 (NKJV) In the thirty-sixth year of the reign of Asa, Baasha king of scrael came up against Judah and built Ramah, that he might let none go out or come in a Asa king of Judah. Chronicles 16:2 (NKJV) Then Asa brought silver and gold from the treasuries of the house of the Lord and of the king's house, and sent to Ben-Hadad king of Syria, who dwelt in Damascus, saying, Chronicles 16:3 (NKJV) "Let there be a treaty between you and me, as there was between my father and your father. See, I have sent you silver and gold; come, break your treaty with Baasha king of Israel, so that he will withdraw from me."
