4. Stewardship versus ownership.

God owns **everything**. We are His **managers**.

1 Corinthians 6:20 (NKJV) For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's.

Matthew 6:19-20 (NIV) Do not store up for yourselves **treasures on earth,** where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves **treasures in heaven**, where moth and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal.

1 Timothy 6:9 (NASB95) But those who want to get rich fall into **temptation** and a **snare** and many foolish and harmful desires which plunge men into **ruin** and **destruction**.

1 Timothy 6:10 (NASB95) For the love of money is **a root** of all sorts of evil, and some by longing for it have **wandered away from the faith** and **pierced themselves** with many griefs.

Jesus talked about **money** twice as much as **heaven and hell**.

16 of the 38 parables of Jesus had to do with money and possessions.

There are over **500** verses about **prayer** and **faith**.

There are over **2000** verses about **money** and **possessions**.

Matthew 6:21 (NKJV) For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

"If a person gets their attitude toward **money** straight, it will help straighten out almost **every other area** of their life." ~Rev. Billy Graham

Luke 16:13 (NKJV) "No servant can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will be loyal to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve **God** and **mammon**."

5. Generosity versus misery.

Acts 20:35 (NIV) The Lord Jesus himself said: "It is more blessed to give than to receive."

Debt is bad, saving is good, **giving is fun**, and stuff is meaningless. ~Angela Cornelia

God's way works.

Malachi 3:7-9 (NIV84) Ever since the time of your forefathers you have turned away from my decrees and have not kept them. Return to me, and I will return to you," says the Lord Almighty. "But you ask, 'How are we to return?'

Malachi 3:10 (NIV84) Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it. Malachi 3:11 (NIV84) I will prevent pests from devouring your crops, and the vines in your fields will not cast their fruit," says the Lord Almighty.

Malachi 3:12 (NIV84) "Then all the nations will call you blessed, for yours will be a **delightful** land," says the Lord Almighty.

Luke 12:15 (LB) Don't always be wishing for what you **don't have**. For real life and real living are **not related to how rich we are**.

Philippians 4:12 (NIV) I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have **learned the secret of being content** in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want.

Contentment is not the fulfillment of **what I want** but the realization of **what I already have**.

3. God dependent versus independent.

Proverbs 18:11 (NIV) The wealth of the rich is **their** fortified city; they **imagine** it a wall **too high to scale**.

How much money would be needed to **secure** your future against all imaginable eventualities?

Proverbs 30:8-9 (NIV) Give me **neither** poverty nor riches, but give me only **my daily bread**. Otherwise, I may have too much and disown you and say, 'Who is the Lord?' Or I may become poor and steal, and so dishonor the name of my God.

I will not trust in riches **but in Him** who richly provides.
