3. Gratitude Fuels Joy and Strengthens Faith

Nehemiah 8:10 (NKJV) The joy of the Lord is your strength."

Thessalonians 5:16 (NKJV) Rejoice always,
 Thessalonians 5:17 (NKJV) pray without ceasing,
 Thessalonians 5:18 (NKJV) in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

Philippians 4:4 (NKJV) Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I will say, rejoice!

4. Gratitude Encourages Generosity and Compassion

Matthew 10:8 (NKJV) Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out demons. Freely you have received, freely give.

2 Corinthians 9:7 (NKJV) So let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver.

Hebrews 11:1 (AMP) NOW FAITH is the assurance (the confirmation, the title deed) of the things [we] hope for, being the proof of things [we] do not see and the conviction of their reality [faith perceiving as real fact what is not revealed to the senses].

Complaining is not faith and will never inherit the promises of God

Acts 5:41 (NKJV) So they departed from the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer shame for His name.

Acts 5:42 (NKJV) And daily in the temple, and in every house, they did not cease teaching and preaching Jesus as the Christ.

Paul and Silas in Prison Read Acts 16

Acts 16:25 (NKJV) But at midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them.

Jesus Feeds 5,000 Read: John 6:1-13

John 6:9 (NKJV) "There is a lad here who has five barley loaves and two small fish, but what are they among so many?"

John 6:10 (NKJV) Then Jesus said, "Make the people sit down." Now there was much grass in the place. So the men sat down, in number about **five thousand**.

John 6:11 (NKJV) And Jesus took the loaves, and when He had given thanks He distributed them to the disciples, and the disciples to those sitting down; and likewise of the fish, as much as they wanted.

Five Things Gratitude Does

Psalm 100:4 (NKJV) Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, And into His courts with praise. Be thankful to Him, and bless His name.

Colossians 3:2 (NKJV) Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth.
