Addiction and depression.

40 to 50% of the people in the United States consider themselves addicted to their cell phones. (Pew research)

Approximately 80% of the people in the US report that they look at their phone within the first 10 minutes of waking up.

70 to 80% of people on social media think it's important for various reasons.

Studies show that there is a 25% to 70% rise in depression among adolescents and young adults over the past two decades.

For teens, depression rates of almost doubled between 2010 and 2020.

Among adults, the increase is more moderate but still significant.

Some issues or challenges of owning smart phones.

1. Constant Distractions and Interruptions

- Notifications and Alerts:
- **Social Media and App Addiction**: The addictive nature of social media and other apps can lead to mindless scrolling, drawing people away from more productive tasks.

2. Time Management

- Overuse and Time Tracking: People often underestimate how much time they spend on their phones. Without mindful time management, hours can be lost each day to activities that offer little real benefit.
- **Multitasking**: The temptation to multitask, such as checking emails while working on a project, can reduce efficiency and lead to lower quality work.

3. Mental Fatigue and Decision Overload

- **Information Overload**: The constant stream of information from smartphones can lead to mental fatigue, making it harder to focus on important tasks.
- **Decision Fatigue**: The need to constantly decide whether to engage with phone content or stay focused on a task can drain cognitive resources.

4. Sleep Disruption

• Late-Night Usage: Many people use their phones late into the night, which can interfere with sleep quality due to the blue light emitted by screens and the mental stimulation from content consumption.

John 17:20 (NKJV)

that they ALL may be ONE, as You, Father, are in Me, and I in You; that they also may be ONE in Us, that the world may believe that You sent Me.

John 17:22 (NKJV)

And the glory which You gave Me I have given them, that **they may be ONE just as We are ONE**: **John 17:23 (NKJV)**

I in them, and You in Me; that they may be made perfect in ONE, and that the <u>world may know</u> that You have sent Me, and have loved them as You have loved Me.

The Bible calls us the family of God. Sin has caused much of the family of God to be dysfunctional. When we yield ourselves to God's word and his Holy Spirit, this function ceases and unity is revealed. Why? Because love for God and love for his family are placed at the forefront.
