6. Contentment is Increased Through a Heart of Generosity Discontentment Stems from Selfishness and Hoarding.

Acts 20:35 (NKJV) "I have shown you in every way, by laboring like this, that you must support the weak. And remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'"

2 Corinthians 9:7 (ESV) "**Each one** must give as he has **decided in his heart**, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."

Proverbs 11:25 (NLT) "The generous will prosper; those who refresh others will themselves be refreshed."

Philippians 4:11 (NKJV) Not that I speak in regard to need, for I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content:

Philippians 4:12 (NKJV) I know how to be abased, and **I know how** to abound. Everywhere and in all things I have learned both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need.

Philippians 4:13 (NKJV) I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.

Ecclesiastes 2:1 (NLT) I said to myself, "Come on, let's try pleasure. Let's look for the 'good things' in life." But I found that this, too, was meaningless.

Ecclesiastes 2:2 (NLT) So I said, "Laughter is silly. What good does it do to seek pleasure?"

Ecclesiastes 2:3 (NLT) After much thought, I decided to cheer myself with wine. And while still seeking wisdom, I clutched at foolishness. In this way, I tried to experience the only happiness most people find during their brief life in this world.

Ecclesiastes 2:4 (NLT) I also tried to find meaning by building huge homes for myself and by planting beautiful vineyards.

Ecclesiastes 2:5 (NLT) I made gardens and parks, filling them with all kinds of fruit trees. **Ecclesiastes 2:6 (NLT)** I built reservoirs to collect the water to irrigate my many flourishing groves.

Ecclesiastes 2:7 (NLT) I bought slaves, both men and women, and others were born into my household. I also owned large herds and flocks, more than any of the kings who had lived in Jerusalem before me.

Ecclesiastes 2:8 (NLT) I collected great sums of silver and gold, the treasure of many kings and provinces. I hired wonderful singers, both men and women, and had many beautiful concubines. I had everything a man could desire!

Ecclesiastes 2:9 (NLT) So I became greater than all who had lived in Jerusalem before me, and my wisdom never failed me.

Ecclesiastes 2:10 (NLT) Anything I wanted, I would take. I denied myself no pleasure. I even found great pleasure in hard work, a reward for all my labors.

Ecclesiastes 2:11 (NLT)

But as I looked at everything I had worked so hard to accomplish, it was all so meaning-less—like chasing the wind. There was nothing really worthwhile anywhere.

1. Contentment Comes from Trusting God to Provide. Discontentment comes from doubting God's Ability to Provide.
