The book "The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People" by Stephen R. Covey was first published on August 15, 1989. It has since become a highly influential book in the field of personal development and leadership.

As my study took me back through 200 years of writing about success, I noticed a startling pattern emerging in the content of the literature. I began to feel more and more that much of the success literature of the past 50 years was superficial. It was filled with **social image consciousness**, techniques and quick fixes -- with **social bandaids** and aspirin that addressed acute problems and sometimes even appeared to solve them temporarily -- but left the underlying chronic problems untouched to fester and resurface time and again. In stark contrast, almost all the literature in the first 150 years or so focused on what could be called the character ethic as the foundation of success -- things like integrity, humility, fidelity, temperance, courage, justice, patience, industry, simplicity, modesty, and the Golden Rule. Benjamin Franklin's autobiography is representative of that literature. It is, basically, the story of one man's effort to integrate certain principles and habits deep within his nature.

The character ethic taught that there are basic principles of effective living, and that people can only experience true success and enduring happiness as they learn and integrate these principles into their basic character.

(Stephen R. Covey-The Seven Habits of Highly Effective People 1989)

- **1. Adam**: Lost man's dominion and placed all humanity under sin. Everyone born after Adam was born into sin.
- **2. Noah** found grace in a world where no one else had any interest in God but were sold out to wickedness.

3. Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob:

Genesis 12-50: Foundational leaders of the Israelite people, leading their families and clans under God's covenant.

4. Moses:

Leader and Lawgiver:

Exodus 3-34: Moses led the Israelites out of Egypt and through the wilderness, receiving the Law from God at Mount Sinai.

5. Joshua:

Conqueror of Canaan:

Joshua 1-24: Joshua led the Israelites into the Promised Land, overseeing the conquest and division of Canaan.

6. Judges:

Temporary Leaders during the Period of Tribal Confederacy:

Judges 1-21: Leaders such as Othniel, Ehud, Deborah, Gideon, and Samson were raised by God to deliver Israel from oppression during this period.

In the book of Judges, the phrase or something similar to "each man did what was right in his own eyes" appears **four times**.

7. Samuel:

Prophet and Last Judge:

1 Samuel 1-12: Samuel was the last judge and a key figure in transitioning Israel from a tribal confederation to a monarchy.

Israel wanted a king, so the Lord gave them one.

In 1 and 2 Kings and 1 and 2 Chronicles is recorded **33 times** where "he did evil in the side of the Lord."

8. Kings:

Monarchs of Israel:

Saul:

1 Samuel 9-31: The first king of Israel, ultimately rejected by God due to disobedience.

David:

1 Samuel 16 - 1 Kings 2: The second king of Israel, known for uniting the tribes and establishing

Jerusalem as the capital.

Solomon:

1 Kings 1-11: David's son, renowned for his wisdom and the construction of the First Temple in Jerusalem.

Divided Kingdom:

After Solomon's death, the kingdom split into two: the Northern Kingdom of Israel and the Southern Kingdom of Judah. Here are the kings, categorized as good or bad:

Kings of the Northern Kingdom of Israel (All were considered bad):

- 1. Jeroboam I (1 Kings 12:25-33): Led Israel into idolatry.
- 2. Nadab (1 Kings 15:25-26): Continued in his father's idolatry.
- 3. Baasha (1 Kings 15:33-34): Wicked like Jeroboam.
- 4. Elah (1 Kings 16:8-13): Followed in the sins of Jeroboam.
- 5. Zimri (1 Kings 16:15-20): Ruled briefly and committed suicide.
- 6. Omri (1 Kings 16:21-28): More evil than all before him.
- 7. Ahab (1 Kings 16:29 22:40): Married Jezebel and promoted Baal worship.
- 8. Ahaziah (1 Kings 22:51 2 Kings 1:18): Walked in the ways of Ahab.
- 9. Joram (Jehoram) (2 Kings 3:1-27): Continued in Ahab's sins.
- 10. Jehu (2 Kings 9:1 10:36): Destroyed Ahab's family but followed Jeroboam's sins.
- 11. Jehoahaz (2 Kings 13:1-9): Continued in the sins of Jeroboam.
- 12. Joash (Jehoash) (2 Kings 13:10-25): Evil like Jeroboam.
- 13. Jeroboam II (2 Kings 14:23-29): Did evil like Jeroboam I.
- 14. Zechariah (2 Kings 15:8-12): Last of Jehu's dynasty, continued in evil.
- 15. Shallum (2 Kings 15:13-15): Assassinated after a month.
- 16. Menahem (2 Kings 15:16-22): Continued in the sins of Jeroboam.
- 17. Pekahiah (2 Kings 15:23-26): Continued in Jeroboam's sins.
- 18. Pekah (2 Kings 15:27-31): Did evil like Jeroboam.
- 19. Hoshea (2 Kings 17:1-6): The last king, led Israel to captivity under Assyria.

Kings of the Southern Kingdom of Judah:

Good Kings of the Southern Kingdom of Judah:

1. Asa (1 Kings 15:9-24): Did what was right in the eyes of the Lord.

- 2. Jehoshaphat (1 Kings 22:41-50): Sought the Lord and walked in His commandments.
- 3. Joash (Jehoash) (2 Kings 12:1-21): Did right under the guidance of Jehoiada the priest.
- 4. Amaziah (2 Kings 14:1-20): Followed the Lord but not wholeheartedly.
- 5. Uzziah (Azariah) (2 Kings 15:1-7): Did right but fell into pride later.
- 6. Jotham (2 Kings 15:32-38): Did what was right, following his father Uzziah.
- 7. Hezekiah (2 Kings 18-20): Trusted in the Lord and reformed Judah's worship.
- 8. Josiah (2 Kings 22-23): Initiated religious reforms and restored the temple.

Bad Kings of the Southern Kingdom of Judah:

- 1. Rehoboam (1 Kings 14:21-31): Allowed idolatry to flourish.
- 2. Abijah (1 Kings 15:1-8): Continued in the sins of his father Rehoboam.
- 3. Jehoram (2 Kings 8:16-24): Walked in the ways of the kings of Israel.
- 4. Ahaziah (2 Kings 8:25-29): Followed the ways of Ahab's family.
- 5. Athaliah (Queen) (2 Kings 11:1-20): Usurped the throne and led Judah into idolatry.
- 6. Ahaz (2 Kings 16:1-20): Sacrificed to idols and closed the temple.
- 7. Manasseh (2 Kings 21:1-18): Reigned the longest and was the most wicked, leading Judah into deep idolatry.
- 8. Amon (2 Kings 21:19-26): Followed in his father Manasseh's wickedness.
- 9. Jehoahaz (2 Kings 23:31-33): Did evil like his ancestors.
- 10. Jehoiakim (2 Kings 23:34 24:7): Did evil and led Judah into idolatry.
- 11. Jehoiachin (2 Kings 24:8-16): Continued in the sins of his fathers.
- 12. Zedekiah (2 Kings 24:17 25:7): The last king of Judah, who rebelled against Babylon, leading to the destruction of Jerusalem.

9. Prophets:

Messengers of God:

Prophets such as Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and Daniel played crucial roles in calling Israel and Judah back to righteousness, offering warnings of judgment, and providing hope for restoration.

10. Post-Exilic Leaders:

Zerubbabel and Ezra:

Ezra 1-10, Nehemiah 1-13: These leaders helped rebuild the temple and restore the law after the Babylonian exile.

Nehemiah:

Nehemiah 1-13: Nehemiah was instrumental in rebuilding the walls of Jerusalem and reforming the community.

James 1:2 (NLT)

Dear brothers and sisters, when troubles of any kind come your way, consider it an opportunity for great joy.

James 1:3 (NLT)

For **you know** that when **your faith** is tested, **your endurance** has a chance to grow. **James 1:4 (NLT)**

So let it grow, for when your endurance is fully developed, you will be perfect and complete, needing nothing.

First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people,

1 Timothy 2:2 (ESV)

for **kings** and **all who are in high positions**, that we may lead a **peaceful and quiet** life, **godly** and **dignified** in every way.

1 Timothy 2:3 (ESV)

This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior,

1 Timothy 2:4 (ESV)

who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.

Supplications are specific requests for oneself.

Prayers are a general term covering all forms of communication with God.

Intercessions are prayers made on behalf of others.

Thanksgivings are prayers focused on expressing gratitude to God for His blessings and actions in our lives.

FORGIVENESS FROM GOD...

1 John 1:9 (NKJV)

If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

THE PEACE OF GOD...

Philippians 4:6 (NKJV)

Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God;

Philippians 4:7 (NKJV)

and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

SUPERNATURAL STRENGTH FROM GOD...

Ephesians 3:14 (NKJV)

For this reason I bow my knees to the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,

Ephesians 3:15 (NKJV)

from whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named,

Ephesians 3:16 (NKJV)

that **He would grant you**, according to the riches of **His glor**y, to be strengthened with might through His Spirit in the inner man,

1 Corinthians 3:5 (NKJV)

2 Corinthians 2:12 (NKJV)

Furthermore, when I came to Troas to preach Christ's gospel, and **a door was opened** to me by the Lord,

Colossians 4:3 (NKJV)

meanwhile **praying also for us, that God would open to us a door** for the word, to speak the mystery of Christ, for which I am also in chains,

Acts 4:29 (NKJV)

Luke 18:1 (NLT)

One day Jesus told his disciples a story to show that they should **always pray** and **never give up**.

Luke 18:2 (NLT)

"There was a judge in a certain city," he said, "who neither feared God nor cared about people.

Luke 18:3 (NLT)

A widow of that city came to him repeatedly, saying, 'Give me justice in this dispute with my enemy.'

Luke 18:4 (NLT)

The judge ignored her for a while, but finally he said to himself, 'I don't fear God or care about people,

Luke 18:5 (NLT)
