Romans 3:23 (NKJV) for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,

Romans 3:24 (NKJV) being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus,

Philippians 3:9 (NKJV) and be found in Him, not having my own righteousness, which is from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ, the righteousness which is from God by faith;

Practical Application:

Stand boldly before God without guilt.

Reject condemnation—walk in your new identity.

Live righteously, empowered by grace (Titus 2:11–12).

7. Jehovah Shammah – "The Lord Is There"

First Mention: Ezekiel 48:35

"...and the name of the city from that day shall be: THE LORD IS THERE."

Revealed Context:

In Ezekiel's temple vision, God promises His abiding presence in the New Jerusalem.

Meaning for Us Today:

God is always present. In Christ, He dwells in us through the Holy Spirit.

Matthew 28:20 (NKJV)

teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen.

Hebrews 13:5 (NKJV)

Let your conduct be without covetousness; be content with such things as you have. For He Himself has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you."

1 Corinthians 3:16 (NKJV)

Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?

Practical Application:

Practice the presence of God in daily life.

Worship and invite His presence often.

Choose to trust Him when over your feelings—He is always there.

The 7 Redemptive Names of God—Their progressive revelation and meaning for believers today.

1. Jehovah Jireh – "The Lord Will Provide"

First Mention: Genesis 22:13–14

"And Abraham called the name of the place, The-LORD-Will-Provide; as it is said to this day, 'In the Mount of the LORD it shall be provided.'" (Genesis 22:14, NKJV)

Context: God provided a ram in place of Isaac, revealing He is our provider—especially in substitutionary sacrifice, which points to Jesus.

Meaning for Us Today: God provides for our spiritual, emotional, and physical needs. Jesus is the ultimate provision.

Philippians 4:19 (NKJV) And my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus.

Romans 8:32 (NKJV) He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things?

Psalms 23:1 (NKJV) The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want.

Practical Application:

Trust God in times of lack—confess His provision daily.

Sow generously and expect harvests (2 Corinthians 9:10).

Keep a gratitude journal of God's daily provision.

2. Jehovah Rapha – "The Lord Who Heals"

First Mention: Exodus 15:26 (NKJV) "For I am the LORD who heals you."

Context: After bitter waters were made sweet, God declared Himself as Israel's Healer.

Meaning for Us Today: Healing—body, soul, and spirit—is in God's redemptive plan. Jesus bore our sicknesses (Isaiah 53:5).

Isaiah 53:4 (NKJV) Surely He has borne our griefs And carried our sorrows; Yet we esteemed Him stricken, Smitten by God, and afflicted.

Isaiah 53:5 (NKJV) But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes we are healed.

Matthew 8:16 (NKJV) When evening had come, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed. And He cast out the spirits with a word, and healed all who were sick,

James 5:14 (NKJV) Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord.

James 5:15 (NKJV) And the prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise him up. And if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven.

Practical Application:

Pray boldly for healing.

Declare healing scriptures.

Minister healing to others as a believer (Mark 16:17–18).

3. Jehovah Nissi – "The Lord Is My Banner"

First Mention: Exodus 17:15 (NKJV) “And Moses built an altar and called its name, The-LORD-Is-My-Banner.”

Context: After victory over Amalek, God reveals He is our banner—our standard in battle.

Meaning for Us Today:

God fights for us. We are covered by His name and victory. Christ is our triumph (2 Corinthians 2:14).

Isaiah 59:19 (NKJV) So shall they fear The name of the Lord from the west, And His glory from the rising of the sun; When the enemy comes in like a flood, The Spirit of the Lord will lift up a standard against him.

2 Chronicles 20:15 (NKJV) And he said, “Listen, all you of Judah and you inhabitants of Jerusalem, and you, King Jehoshaphat! Thus says the Lord to you: ‘Do not be afraid nor dismayed because of this great multitude, for the battle is not yours, but God’s.

Romans 8:37 (NKJV) Yet in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us.

Practical Application:

Worship as warfare.

Speak God’s promises in conflict.

Remember past victories to build present faith.

4. Jehovah Shalom – "The Lord Is Peace"

First Mention: Judges 6:24 (NKJV) “So Gideon built an altar there to the LORD, and called it The-LORD-Is-Peace.”

Context:

God gives peace to Gideon in the face of fear and impossible odds.

Meaning for Us Today:

Jesus is the Prince of Peace who gives us peace in the storm, not just from the storm.

Isaiah 26:3 (NKJV) You will keep him in perfect peace, Whose mind is stayed on You, Because he trusts in You.

John 14:27 (NKJV) Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

Philippians 4:6 (NKJV) Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God;

Philippians 4:7 (NKJV) and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

Practical Application:

Meditate on scripture to defeat anxiety.

Start and end your day in fellowship with God your Father.

Pursue peace in relationships (Hebrews 12:14).

5. Jehovah Raah – "The Lord Is My Shepherd"

First Mention: Psalm 23:1 (NKJV) “The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want.”

Context:

David acknowledges God’s care, guidance, and protection.

Meaning for Us Today:

Jesus is the Good Shepherd who leads, feeds, and protects us (John 10:11).

John 10:11 (NKJV) “I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd gives His life for the sheep.

Ezekiel 34:11 (NKJV) ‘For thus says the Lord God: “Indeed I Myself will search for My sheep and seek them out.

Ezekiel 34:12 (NKJV) As a shepherd seeks out his flock on the day he is among his scattered sheep, so will I seek out My sheep and deliver them from all the places where they were scattered on a cloudy and dark day.

Hebrews 13:20 (NKJV) Now may the God of peace who brought up our Lord Jesus from the dead, that great Shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant,

Hebrews 13:21 (NKJV) make you complete in every good work to do His will, working in you what is well pleasing in His sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen.

Practical Application:

Let God lead your decisions.

Daily endeavor to listen and obey to the voice of the Shepherd (John 10:27).

Stay in fellowship with the flock (church).

6. Jehovah Tsidkenu – "The Lord Our Righteousness"

First Mention: Jeremiah 23:6 (NKJV) “...Now this is His name by which He will be called: THE LORD OUR RIGHTEOUSNESS.”

Context:

A Messianic prophecy declaring Jesus as the source of righteousness.

Meaning for Us Today:

We are made righteous through Christ—not by works but by faith (2 Corinthians 5:21).

2 Corinthians 5:21 (NKJV) For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.
