

## 6. You Are Heir to Every Promise by Faith

**Galatians 3:22 (NKJV)** But the Scripture has confined all under sin, that the promise by faith in Jesus Christ might be given to those who believe.

**Galatians 3:16 (NKJV)**

Now to Abraham and his Seed were the promises made. He does not say, "And to seeds," as of many, but as of one, "And to your Seed," who is Christ.

**Galatians 3:29 (NKJV)** If you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise.

**Action Steps:** Write down and declare God's promises. They are your inheritance. Expect them to manifest—not because of your goodness, but because of your position in Christ.

## 7. You Are Empowered by the Spirit to Live Blessed

**Galatians 3:14 (NKJV)** that the blessing of Abraham might come upon the Gentiles in Christ Jesus, that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith.

**Acts 1:8 (NKJV)** But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

**Action Steps:** Live by the Spirit. Let Him lead you into the fullness of blessing—peace, power, purpose, and prosperity. The Spirit within is proof that the blessing is yours.



## Redeemed - Part 5 – God's Rescue Plan

### 1. You Are Redeemed from the Curse of the Law

**Galatians 3:13 (NKJV)** Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law, having become a curse for us (for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree"),

**Galatians 3:14 (NKJV)** that the blessing of Abraham might come upon the Gentiles in Christ Jesus, that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith.

**Galatians 3:10 (NKJV)** For as many as are of the works of the law are under the curse; for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who does not **continue in all things** which are written in the book of the law, to do them."

**Colossians 2:13 (NKJV)** And you, being dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, He has made alive together with Him, having forgiven you all trespasses, **Colossians 2:14 (NKJV)** having wiped out the handwriting of requirements that was against us, which was contrary to us. And He has taken it out of the way, having nailed it to the cross.

**Action Steps:** Don't accept what Jesus redeemed you from—poverty, spiritual death, and sickness. Reject the curse by renewing your mind to the Word and declaring freedom in Christ.

### 2. You Are Made Righteous by Faith, Not Works

**Galatians 3:11 (NKJV)** But that no one is justified by the law in the sight of God is evident, for "the just shall live by faith."

**Galatians 3:6 (NKJV)** just as Abraham "believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness."

**Ephesians 2:8 (NKJV)** For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God,  
**Ephesians 2:9 (NKJV)** not of works, lest anyone should boast.  
**Ephesians 2:10 (NKJV)** For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them.

**Action Steps:** Stop striving to earn God's approval. Rest in the righteousness that is yours by faith in Jesus. Live boldly knowing you're accepted in Christ.

### 3. You Are Blessed with Believing Abraham

**Galatians 3:9 (NKJV)** So then those who are of faith are blessed with believing Abraham.

**Galatians 3:14 (NKJV)** that the blessing of Abraham might come upon the Gentiles in Christ Jesus, that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith.

**Action Steps:** Speak and expect the blessing of Abraham in your life—favor, increase, protection, and covenant provision—because you are his seed through Christ.

### 4. You Are a New Creation with a New Identity

**2 Corinthians 5:17 (NKJV)** Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.  
**2 Corinthians 5:18 (NKJV)** Now all things are of God, who has reconciled us to Himself through Jesus Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation,  
**2 Corinthians 5:19 (NKJV)** that is, that God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not imputing their trespasses to them, and has committed to us the word of reconciliation.  
**2 Corinthians 5:20 (NKJV)** Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore you on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God.  
**2 Corinthians 5:21 (NKJV)** For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

**Galatians 3:26 (NKJV)** For you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus.  
**Galatians 3:27 (NKJV)** For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ.

**Colossians 2:13 (NKJV)** And you, being dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, He has made alive together with Him, having forgiven you all trespasses,

**Action Steps:** Stop identifying with your past. Your new identity in Christ qualifies you to walk in divine inheritance. Say daily, "I am a new creation—redeemed and blessed."

### 5. You Are No Longer Under the Law but Under Grace

**Galatians 3:24 (NKJV)** Therefore the law was our tutor to bring us to Christ, that we might be justified by faith.

**Galatians 3:25 (NKJV)** But after faith has come, we are no longer under a tutor.

**Galatians 3:18 (NKJV)** For if the inheritance is of the law, it is no longer of promise; but God gave it to Abraham by promise.

**Galatians 3:23 (NKJV)** But before faith came, we were kept under guard by the law, kept for the faith which would afterward be revealed.

**Action Steps:** Live from the finished work of Christ. The law shows our need for Jesus; grace empowers us to live like Him. Embrace God's promises by faith, not effort.
